RELOCATION OF LAID-OFF EMPLOYEES

Mr. Don Boudria (Glengarry-Prescott-Russell): Mr. Speaker, during the 1984 election campaign the Leader of the Conservative Party sent a letter to the public servants of Canada. I will read to you one such letter that was sent to Mr. Jack Donegani, President of the Professional Institute of the Public Service of Canada. It says in part:

A PC government will negotiate directly with public service unions and associations toward the establishment of an improved collective bargaining system based on the provisions of the Canada Labour Code.

It says further:

We will pursue joint bargaining as a means of achieving greater fairness and efficiency in the collective bargaining process.

What a difference a year makes, Mr. Speaker. During the year 1985 some 2,464 employees of the Public Service of Canada were declared surplus to the Government's need. The Government went out of its way to tell the public servants of the country that it would help them to relocate and find other jobs within the Public Service. As of January 3, 1986, 1,999 of those employees had yet to be relocated. The failure rate of the Government in terms of relocating public servants to other jobs within the Government has been in the order of 80 per cent

It is a disgrace. Perhaps the Minister of Justice (Mr. Crosbie) said it best during the election campaign when he said to the people of Canada and to the media: "If the people of this country knew what the Progressive Conservatives wanted to do, we would never get elected".

COST OF GOVERNMENT BORROWINGS

Mr. Gordon Taylor (Bow River): Mr. Speaker, workers in Canada know that if they continually spend more than they make they will end up in the poor house. Businessmen who spend beyond their income, even though the expenditures are for good purposes, will go bankrupt and lose everything they have. For many years the Government, under the Liberals, and aided by the NDP, spent millions of dollars that it did not have, and now \$1 out of every \$3 collected in taxes goes to pay the interest only, without reducing the debt that was built up through their extravagance.

If this borrowing continues, the interest will increase until we are paying \$2, then \$3 out of every \$3 collected, and then \$4, until our credit is ruined and we cannot borrow any more and we can't pay our bills. We will have to cut out donations for worthy causes and we will have to cut pensions for the
