My dear Principal,

Forgive me for not answering your letter to me of February 8th at an earlier date. The reason for this delay has been that the acceptance and allocation of medals and prizes can only be made by the Faculty in full session. I need hardly add, however, that I know that the whole Faculty will appreciate very highly indeed the courtesy and kindness of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province in offering these medals for competition in the College. I shall suggest to the Faculty, which meets on Friday next at 4 p.m., that the silver medal be awarded to the student standing highest in the final or fourth year honours in the Department of History, and the bronze medal to the student in the second year achieving the highest standing in Latin and Mathematics. This allocation may, as I suggested, be changed by the Faculty itself, and if it is I shall notify you immediately.
