

The water in James Bay in the vicinity of the mouth of Moose River is somewhat low.
The rise and fall at spring tides is about ten feet; at neaps about six feet.
High water at full and change of moon. At ebb.

Sea going ships come to the Inner Ship Hole from the direction of A. Elsewhere the
sand and mud bottom.

The dotted line from the Inner Ship Hole indicates the channel followed by schooners.
The head of tide water is about eight miles above Moose Factory or twenty miles from
The continuous shore-line indicates the ordinary high tide mark. Extraordinary
occasionally flood back to the line of bushes.
