The people belonging to the McKeage Road and Kingsey Siding Mission met the Bishop in conference at Pope's School House, on the 29th November. After a short and appropriate service, the congregation resolved itself into a Consultation Committee, for the purpose of discussing the question of the proposed new church, and to decide upon the site,—Mr. Moyles being willing to give the necessary amount of ground adjoining the School House, distant about six miles from Danville; while Mr. Chadsey offered a handsome two acre corner lot, distant two or three hundred yards from Kingsey Siding station, and about four miles from Danville. It was agreed that the matter should be decided by the Bishop, who, after hearing the pros and cons of the case, accepted Mr. Chadsey's offer. vote of thanks was immediately and unanimously voted to the generous donor. It is to be hoped that before I am called upon to write another report we shall see a neat little church built, paid for, consecrated, and well filled.

During the summer I carried on a missionary service every Friday, alternately at Pope's School House and the Mountain Settlement, two miles south of the Pinacle.

I have to thank my indefatigable warden, Mr. Devey, of Danville, for the manner in which he has discharged his duties. Were it not for his untiring activity and intelligent zeal in all matters concerning the Church, the Shipton Mission would have suffered. His eldest daughter has kindly undertaken to collect for the Church Society, her sister, Miss Lillie, only thirteen years of age, presides most efficiently at the harmonium.

Our Church Society collectors in Troutbrook are Miss

Betsy Thurber and Miss Jane Robertson.

There is a debt on the Parsonage of three hundred dollars, covered by a mortgage at ten per cent.; the interest is paid (as rent) by the Incumbent in charge.

The Registers indicate 18 baptisms, 10 burials, and 2

marriages.
