- sābook*, (*sebāk*), (local name); a narrow strait or passage.
sakpedīlc, Smoky-Head, C. B.; a smooth bathing-place.
sāmkoock, Thee Rivers, P. E. I.; a sandy shore.
sāsooguloomin, the place above Shubenacadie River; abound-
 ing in quartz crystals.
sāwogle, Sewogle in Miramichi.
sebāgun, Bird Passage; the opening or passage.
sebāguntcētc, The Passage, Bay Chaleur; the little narrows.
sebulogwōkun, Fox Island; the drying-place.
sebunisk, Locke's Island.
sedabuktoock, (*icebuktoock*), Chedabucto; the deep extending (great) harbour.
sēskoock-sēboo, Guay's River; a muddy river.
sēskoock-wolnā, Sunbury Cove, P. E. I.; the muddy cove.
segubunākade, Shubenacadie; the place of the *sebugun*, a native potato or ground-nut.
segunakadētc, Rice Point, P. E. I.; small remnants
segunakigunuk, Little Harbour, east of Hx.; torn in shreds; sail scraps.
segwāk, Brule Harbour, a barren place.
sēssetkoock, (*tcēssetkoock*), Chezet-
 koock; flowing rapidly in many channels.
setunook, the Avon River at Windsor, North Cape, P. E. I.; a lake extending back.
sibosēs, a river in Miramichi, (2) Brooklet; the little river.
sibumeadoock, Brookfield, Colch, Co.
sigunikt, (*tcigunikt*), Chignecto
sigunokigunok, Pope's Harbour
siktāweak, stewiake; (2) Jordan River; oozing from dead water.
simkoock, Petite River.
simogwesk, Shemogue River, Simon's River.
simogwik, Shemogue, Simon's Pl. named after a Frenchman.
skumakun, Fort Lot, P. E. I.; the stockade.
sogumkēgun, Shelbourne; a short cut through a sand-bar.
soolākade, Mira, C. B. the silver-place.
sooleāwāgītk, Lake on Lahave River; floating silver.
soōnakadē, Sunacadie, C. B., the cranberry-patch.
soonmesonek, place in Gut of Canso.
