

PLACE-NAMES

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- sābook*, (*sebāk*), (local name); a narrow strait or passage.
- sakpeditc*, Smoky-Head, C. B.; a smooth bathing-place.
- sāmkook*, Thee Rivers, P. E. I.; a sandy shore.
- sāsooguloomin*, the place above Shubenacadie River; abounding in quartz crystals.
- sāwōgle*, Sewogle in Miramichi.
- sebāgun*, Bird Passage; the opening or passage.
- sebāguntētē*, The Passage, Bay Chaleur; the little narrows.
- sebulogwokun*, Fox Island; the drying-place.
- sebunisk*, Locke's Island.
- sedabuktook*, (*tcebuktook*), Che-dabucto; the deep extending (great) harbour.
- sēskook-sēboo*, Guay's River; a muddy river.
- sēskook-wolnā*, Sunbury Cove, P. E. I.; the muddy cove.
- segubunākade*, Shubenacadie; the place of the *sebugun*, a native potato or ground-nut.
- segunakadētē*, Rice Point, P. E. I.; small remnants
- segunakigunuk*. Little Harbour, east of Hx.; torn in shreds; sail scraps.
- segwāk*, Brule Harbour, a bar-
- ren place.
- sēsetkook*, (*tcēsetkook*), Chezett-kook; flowing rapidly in many channels.
- setunoook*, the Avon River at Windsor, North Cape, P. E. I.; lake extending back.
- sibosēs*, a river in Miramichi, (2) Brooklet; the little river.
- sibumeadook*, Brookfield, Colch, Co.
- sigunikt*, (*tcigunikt*), Chignecto
- sigunokigunok*, Pope's Harbour
- siktawēak*, stewake; (2) Jordan River; oozing from dead water.
- simkook*, Petite River.
- simogwesk*, Shemogue River, Simon's River.
- simogwik*, Shemogue, Simon's Pl. named after a Frenchman.
- skunakun*, Fort Lot, P. E. I.; the stockade.
- sogumkēgun*, Shelburne; a short cut through a sand-bar.
- soolākade*, Mira, C. B. the silver-place.
- sooleāwāgitk*, Lake on Lahave River; floating silver.
- soōnakadē*, Sunacadie, C. B., the cranberry-patch.
- soonmesonek*, place in Gut of Canso.
