The Rishop embarked with his friends, and sailed from St. John's, on the 28th of June. Mr. Gifford left on the 16th of August. The rest remained on board the whole voyage—nearly four months. With the exception of the loss of an anchor, the vessel received no damage.

The crew consisted of a captain, mate, and four seanon, with a steward and cabin-boy: in the cabin were the Bishop and his four companions,—thirteen persons in all. Visitors were frequently entertained on board, but always with simplicity and frugality.
