And to Great-Britain, this acquisition alone, if maintained, will probably much more than make good all the damage she sustained in the former respect; which, if I mistake not, time and experience make still less and less considerable.

Bur while our thoughts are in that part of the world, where to valuable and noble an acquisition has been made, by the bleffing of God on the British arms; while our thoughts are engaged in that part of the world, I fay, and on so worthy and joyful an occalion; what is it that still gives a kind of damp to. my spirits; or rather, raises my indignation? While British fleet rides fafely and quietly in port, do I feen inferior French one failing, in a kind of triumph, rom port to port, from illand to illand, from one nonth to another? Do I see our merchantmen, by cores, or hundreds, taken within hearing of the British annon, if they were but discharged?
