Harrington testified yesterday that Darrow had shown him last September a roll of bills which Darrow said contained \$50,000 and were procured from "Tveitmore's Bank in San Francisco, that Darrow told him at the time that if he could arrange to reach two jurymen, James D. McNamara would never be convicted.

Harington also testified that on the morning of Bert Franklin's arrest for attempting to bribe Gtorge N. Lockwood, Darrow had said to him: "My God; if he speaks I am ruined."


