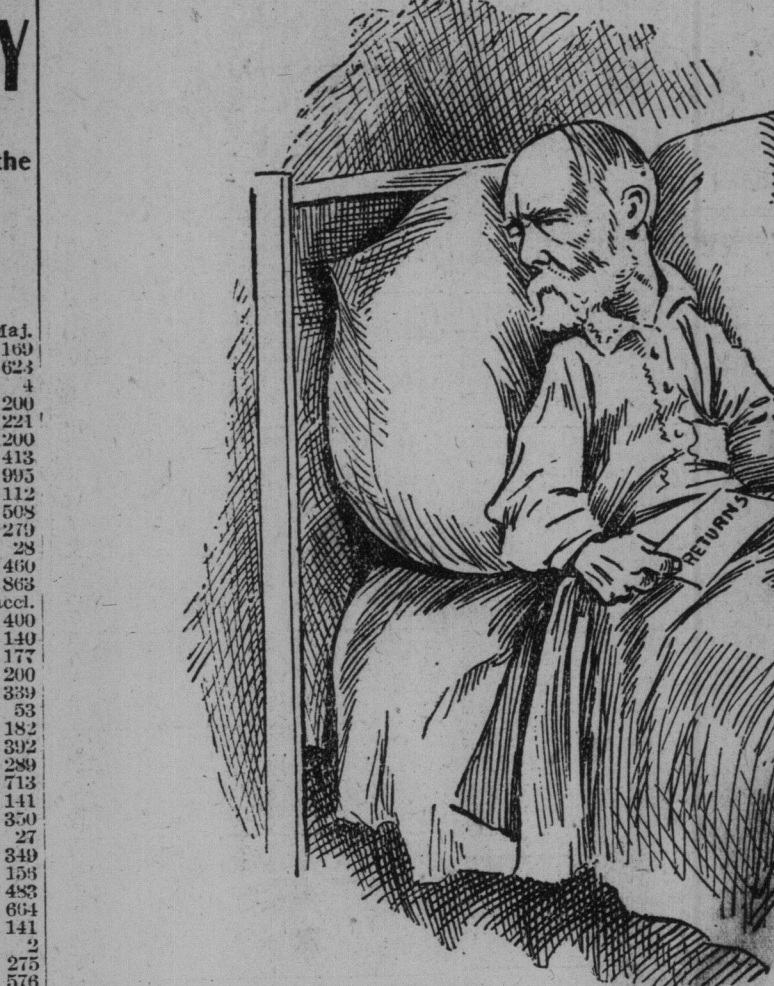

Returns All Received Give Him a Majority in the Neighborhood of 30.

CLAIMED LIBERALS SPENT \$5000. But Drop in Majority Attributed by Times to Attitude on County Council Question.

Kingston, May 30.—(Special).—Sheriff Thomas Dawson is the returning officer for Frontenac and he will make his official declaration of the result of the voting at his office in the Court House on Wednesday.

PROTECT THE BALLOT BOXES.

"Protect the boxes!" This is the injunction sent out to every Conservative worker in the province, and that it will be strenuously obeyed there is little ground to fear in view of the note of warning sent along with it.

The letters were sent out from the central rooms of the Ontario Conservative Association. They were despatched without any delay, because of information received to the effect that several recognized Liberal ballot box manipulators had left their places of residence for points where the majorities were reported to be close.
