PORT STANLEY.
Mr. James Payne, of Port Stanley, died Monday night, after nine days' illness, aged 57 years. The deceased was the eldest son of Mr. Alfred Payne, of Port Stanley. He was for years tax collector and assessor, and was a county constable, and a member of the Elgin County Constables' Association. Besides his widow, he leaves four sons and four daughters. CHANGED A POLLING BOOTH.
Late last night Medical Health Officer Hutchinson reported to the returning officer his opinion that a case of scarlet fever had been detected at the house of Mrs. Donohue, 460 Paul Street, the place selected as the polling booth for subdivision 5 of ward four.

The returning officer hesitated to take any action in view of the lack of definite assurance. The attending physician, Dr. Johnston, who made the report, was not stated positively that the case was not one of scarlet fever. The rumor that a infectious disease existed in the house had been spread in the meantime throughout the subdivision, and notwithstanding the absence of any proof of scarlet fever, the returning officer thought it better to change the polling booth, where he did, selecting Mr. C. Taylor's house, three doors west. This was done so that no objection might be made by voters, while the case of scarlet fever in the original polling booth was being investigated.
