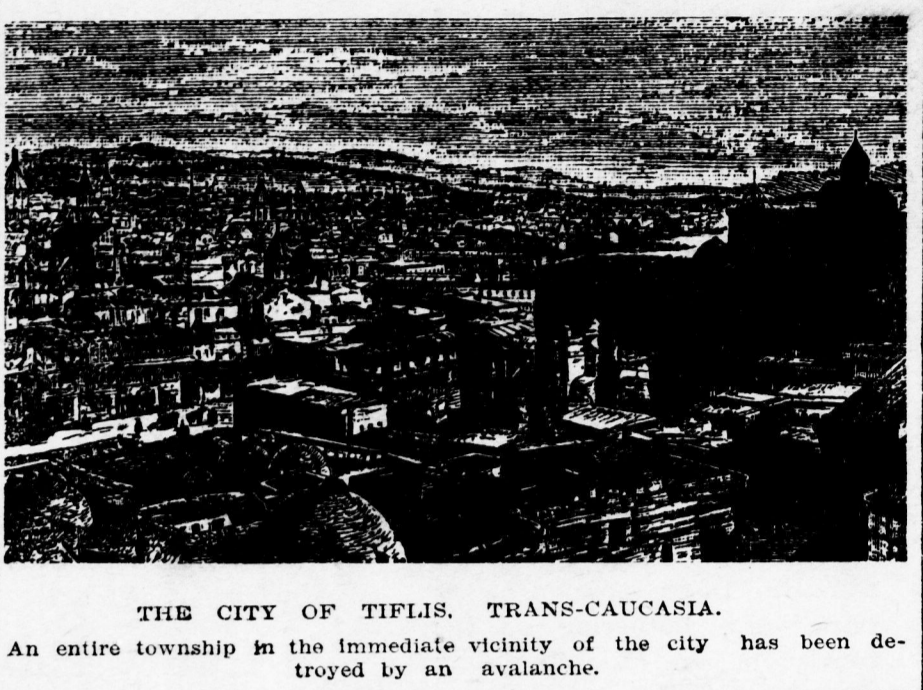


RUSSIAN BIG GUNS TRAINED ON JEWS; 2,000 WERE MASSACRED IN POLISH CITY

Two Days' Slaughter of Innocent Follows Terrorist Attacks on Patrolmen and Soldiers—Infuriated Troops Make Shambles of Siedlce.

Siedlce, Poland Sept. 10.—A Jewish massacre surpassing in seriousness all previous ones in this vicinity took place here Saturday and Sunday.

The ghastly work of murdering and pillaging continued until early today, when Governor-General Skallon telegraphed for permission to use the artillery.

This morning squads of soldiers were parading through the streets, selling pillaged watches and jewelry.

Mud Slide in Caucasus; Buries Whole Township

Tiflis, Sept. 10.—Practically without warning, the side of a mountain rising above the township of Kvaraveli broke away, and in a set of semi-liquid mud, sand and stones, slid down on the township and overwhelmed it.

Kvaraveli Township occupies an area of five kilometers, in the district of Telavisi in the Caucasus. Similar disasters are of common occurrence in Caucasian valleys.

TROLLEYS IN A CRASH ON BROOKLYN BRIDGE

New York, Sept. 10.—Twelve persons were injured, one of them fatally, in a collision between two trolley cars in the New York end of Brooklyn bridge today.

Both ends of the second car were wrecked. In the crash Motorman Julius Scharff, of the third car, was probably fatally hurt.
