HAMILTON, May 17.—(Special).—The two factions of the street railway men had a meeting Saturday evening and came to an agreement under which they all go back into one fold. The arrangement is that the younger men are to have a week of nights off out of every three weeks. This will have to be sanctioned by the Ontario railway municipal board before it becomes effective as the arrangement under which the men work now gives the day work to the older men, and was patched up by the board.
