Fredericton, N. B. March 25—(Special)—
The Lumber and Limit Holders' Association which has been in session here for two days had a conference with the surveyor general this morning. Yesterday atternoon the association elected Hon. John P. Burchill president, Henry Hilyard, vice president, and R. A. Lawlor, secretary.

The conference this morning was in connection with the presenting of a memorial setting forth their views on the matter of business relations between the lesses of the crown lands and the government.
