Financial and Commercial MONEY AND THE MARKET

The Situation is One of Exceptional Interest—Loans and Reserve—Banks and Trust Companies—When Public Takes Hold—Investment Matters.

The whole money situation this autumn is of exceptional interest—trust company taking of loans to relieve the banks and Europe called on for gold to insure maintenance of equilibrium.

Loans and Reserve (Wall Street Journal)

A comparison of the condition of thirty-three New York City trust companies at the end of the month of Sept. 1 with the condition of the Clearing House banks at the same date shows considerable light upon money market conditions.

Loans increased \$17,425,000. Cash reserve decreased \$1,425,000. The comparison could only be brought up to date by the changes in the Clearing House banks.
