High Schools of Ontario.

Each of these schools (which form the intermediate link between the public schools and the universities) is managed by a board of trustees appointed jointly by the county and town councils. In cities the trustees are all appointed by the city council, except where there is only one school in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial university, and obtain a certificate of fitness from the Education Department. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of the Government grant must be raised.
