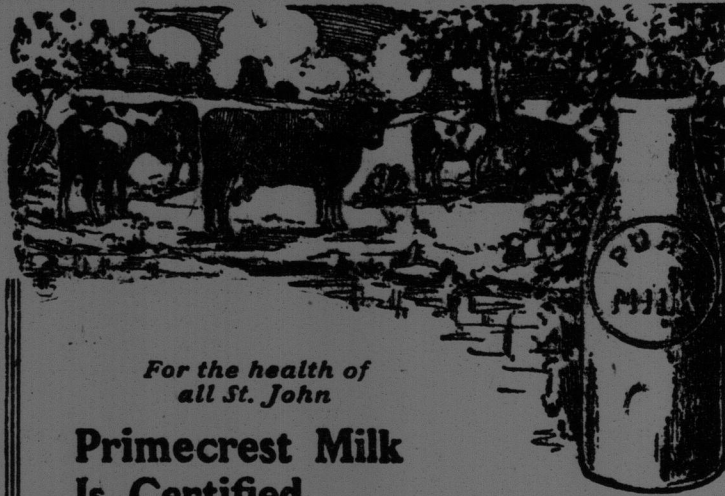

GRAPE SHADE OF VELVET LOVELY
FACING FOR YOUR LATE WINTER HAT

This sketch shows how velvet is put on inside the hat first, then turned over the brim. Next the lower part of brim left white in cut, is covered.

("Home Millinery" Lesson by Clarissa Chesley)

A lovely grape shade of velvet or the putty color which is favorite of the season can be used to cover the hat which I am describing in this article. Black velvet also could be used for the facing. Start the work of covering by placing the corner of the velvet directly at the front inside the crown. The inside of the brim is fitted and then the velvet cut, leaving at least a half-inch margin to go over the edge.

After milliner's glue has been applied to the velvet and it is smoothed out on the brim, the edge of velvet is carefully turned over and whipped down.

The velvet is next fitted and pasted down on the outside of the brim to within an inch of the edge after allowing another half inch for the turn-over. A wire is inserted at the edge and the velvet turned over that. The edges of the inside and the outside are then

They are found teeming with bacteria and riddled with disease. INCREASED PAY.

The Imperial Merchant Service Guild having made certain submissions on the

matter to the Admiralty are now informed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that it has been decided to increase the pay of lieutenant commanders, Royal Naval Reserve, from ten to thirteen shillings a day, i. e., the minimum rate of full pay of a lieutenant commander R. N. This will be applicable only to officers of the permanent Royal Naval Reserve force, who have been granted the rank of lieutenant

commander on attaining eight years seniority as lieutenant. The increase will take effect as from August 1 last.

Hon. Thomas Bain, ex-speaker of the house of commons in Canada, died yesterday at his home in Dundas, Ont., after having been ill since October last. He was eighty years of age and a native of Scotland.
