# Two Laborites Back Unemployment Aid

OTTAWA, Jan. 29.—The announcement that the Federal Government will again participate in unemployment relief where an emergency exists has

met with approval from the two labor members of parliament, J. F. Woods-worth and A. A. Heaps, of Winnipeg. They stated today that this will mean relief for many thousands of

needy persons who would otherwise have gone without. Where the provincial and municipal authorities find that unemployment exists so acutely as to constitute an emergency they can call on the Federal authorities to contribute on a basis of one-third relieving the emergency.
