Until there is a gain in outside participation in market we can see no reason to expect anything but small profit-taking reactions. We think the trend of the market is distinctly upward, and we expect new high prices in many parts of the list. If the Industrials show any inclination to quiet down, we believe rais will again he brought into prominence. Consequently, we think that since they are dull at this time, Central, Atchison, So. Rallway, C. & O., and Southern Pacific can be bought. We do not see any end yet to the tremendous upward move that has taken place in Steel and Gen. Motors. After actir g rather badly for several days, Mack Trucks has picked up again and we expect it to sell above 120 in the next week or so. Pan. American issues were bought heavily at the opening and then quieted down. We think they are going much higher and believe they are a purchase at present levels. Other good oils look higher under leadership of Texas Co. Sloss Shefield may move up closer to U. S. Steel again. We still think that this stock will sell above 200. Today Is 711th Magna Charta Pilgrimage Anniversary

TODAY is the anniversary of the

signing of Magna Charta (Great Charter) and under the auspices of the International Magna Charta Day Association and interested organizations an annual commemoration is held in many centres. has been stated by the association to be first the developing of English-speaking patriotism and cooperation by linking the English-speaking nations more closely toether, thus aiding world peace; and by rousing race consciousness making it more difficult for unwise making it more difficult for unwise racilism to develop and for enemies to sow trouble. The second great aim is stated as building a respect for law. The observance of the third Sunday in June as Magna Charta Sunday in churches and Sunday Schools is also urged as part of the annual commemoration. The Magna Charta was signed by King John, June 15, 1215, at Runnymede.

Maritime Body Likely to Open Inquiry Soon

OTTAWA, June 14—Sir Andrew Rae Duncan, chairman of the commission recently appointed to investigate the question of Maritime rights, is expected to arrive in Canada from England before the end of the present month.

Arrangements are being made to hold sittings of the commission shortly after the arrival of Sir Andrew. Announcement to this effect was made in the House of Commons this afternoon by Premier W. L. Mackenzie King, in answer to a question by Murray MacLaren, Conservative, Saint John-Albert.
