TO HOLD VALERIA TILLERIN CALM

Fitzgerald in Genoa Interview, Likens Ireland's Struggle to Italy's.

Genoa, Sept. 6.—William T. Cosgrave, President of the Irish Free State; Desmond Fitzgerald, foreign minister, and Prof. John MacNeill, minister of education, who are among the large number of Irishmen who came to Genoa for the celebration of the birth of St. Columbanus, who was born in Limerick, Ireland, in the year 543, left for Genoa to speak before the assembly of the League of Nations. Before leaving they prayed in Gaelic at the tomb of the saint.

Mr. Fitzgerald said Ireland had struggled against her oppressors, much like Italy against Austria during the war for independence. For this reason, he said, there was much sympathy between the two countries. Concerning the internal situation in Ireland, Mr. Fitzgerald said all Ireland was tranquil, but there were still many arms hidden which the Government was gradually confiscating, as it could not run the risk of a fresh rebellion.

Eamon de Valera, who, Mr. Fitzgerald characterized as the leading agitator in Ireland, must remain a prisoner until the pacification of the country is complete. He said it had not been decided whether De Valera would be interned or tried. He said his followers had caused enormous damage in Ireland.

The buildings, railways and bridges that had destroyed were valued at more than £20,000,000, according to Mr. Fitzgerald.

The foreign minister declared that the recent elections would give an enormous majority to the Government in the Dail Eireann. He added that a commission would soon be appointed for the delimitation of the frontier between Ulster and southern Ireland. Ulster considered the Free State barbarians, but he was sure that when Ulster realized the loyalty of the Free State in carrying out the treaty with Great Britain, Ulster would spontaneously join in a unified Ireland.
