GOING TO ENGLAND British Museum Gets Odd Bequest; Wealthy Rothchild's Flea Collection

London, Nov. 19-The scientists of the natural history department of the British Museum are delighted at a remarkable bequest from the late Nathaniel Rothchild, the largest and nearest complete collection of fleas in the world. It comprises several thousand specimens, each preserved in a tiny bottle.

Only a wealthy enthusiast could ever have gathered such an exhibition, for no government would be willing to spend the money which it cost Mr. Rothschild and no scientific institution could afford to do so.

Mr. Rothschild often commissioned exploring expeditions to find speci-mens of fleas infesting certain animals or birds in far parts of the world and he is credited with having once financed an expedition to Greenland to obtain fleas of the Arctic seal.

Major Austen, of the Insect Department of the Museum, said the collection contained specimens of nearly all the distinct kinds of fleas in the world and that it was particularly valuable for the study of their disease carrying properties. Mr. Rothschild was the world's foremost authority in this branch of

study which he made peculiarly his own.




