REJECTS DEMAND FOR GENERAL WORK

WEEK OF 44 HOURS London, Dec. 5. — (By Canadian Press.)—The Australian commonwealth court of arbitration has rejected the demand of the combined trades unions for the reduction of the standard working week throughout Australia from forty-eight hours to forty-four hours, according to a cable from Reuter's correspondent at Melbourne.

The president of the court, in announcing the decision, said that such reduction of hours would greatly add to the ranks of the unemployed and would also seriously affect the Australian industries, which, if the demand for a forty-four hour week were granted, would be un-

McLennan, president of the Board of Trade. Mr. McLennan was a member of a civic committee which recently visited Ottawa and Toronto in search of rail orders, and reported on their return that the order had been promised to the Sydney steel plant.

ALBERTA SEAT IS DECLARED VACANT
