The champion runner was Flick of Cleveland, who made 38. The record for stolen bases was made by Flick and Anderson of Washington jointly, both men having stolen 29 bases during the season. The leading martyr of the season was Jones of St. Louis, who made forty sacrifice hits. Flick of Cleveland and Anderson of Washington making 23 each.

The greatest number of errors in the League was made by Parent, shortstop for Boston who played in 143 games and made 85 errors. His average was, however, .283, and he ranked sixth out of a total of 13 shortstops.

Cleveland carried off the honors in leading as well as in batting, and ranked the highest as a team, its average being .268; Chicago was second with an average of .263; Boston was last with an average of .248.

WRESTLING

THIS BEEL IS A WONDER.

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 14.—Fred Beel, champion wrestler of America, successfully defended his title at Brooks Casino tonight by taking two straight falls from "Yankee" Rogers of Boston. The first fall was gained after 11m. 41s. and the second in 2m. 36s.

The great difference in size of the two men was apparent when they entered the ring and shook hands. Beel is 5 feet 4 inches and weighs 147 pounds, while Rogers is 6 feet 2 inches and tips the scale at 210 pounds.

The first fall was somewhat of an accident. Beel had Rogers against the ropes with "Yankee's" leg twisted about one of the struts. Referee Francis ordered the men to the center, and before Rogers could recover Beel nailed "Yankee" with a croch and head hold and planked his shoulders squarely to the mat.

Beel was more aggressive in the second round, forcing "Yankee" to squirm out of all sorts of dangerous positions. Twice Rogers broke away from Beel's head lock and was widely applauded. But the New Englander's strength was giving way and the third attempt of Beel was successful.

In the preliminaries Demitral defeated Devluk two out of three, and Olson threw Sorenson two out of three. Devluk, who was defeated in one of the preliminaries, wrestled here last winter.
