## Interesting Lady Visitor To St. John

Mrs. F. L. Aikman of Jacksonville, Florida, is Member of Both Canadian and United States Order Daughters of the Empire.

Mrs. F. L. Aikman, who is in St. John for a few days, and whose home is at present in Jacksonville, Florida, is a prominent member of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, and also of the Imperial Order Daughters of the British Empire, which is the branch in the United States.

An Englishwoman by birth, Mrs. Aikman was formerly a resident of Toronto and a member of the Municipal Chapter of that city. Removing to Chicago to live, she interested herself in the order there, and was elected a member of the Prince of Wales Chapter. Since that time she has done some organizing work for the Order throughout the States, and visits as an associate member in the Chapter in Jacksonville, where she makes her home at present.

Speaking to The Standard of the work of the Order in Chicago, Mrs. Aikman said that twenty chapters have been instituted in Illinois by the present state president, Mrs. G. Cooke Adams. The Prince of Wales Chapter was the charter chapter, being organized in January, 1913, and seventeen local chapters followed in quick succession. Other chapters are in process of formation.

The names of the chapters show their truly British spirit, as for example: The Windsor, the King Alfred, the Gladstone, the Lloyd George, the Kharoum, the Queen Mother, the Kewthorpe, the Robert Burns.

There are now over one thousand members with a steadily increasing list. In Chicago one of the chief activities was the establishment of a home for Aged British men and women. In this the local chapters are co-operating with the charter chapter (the Prince of Wales). It is the intention to have such homes in the West, South and East, one being already established at Staten Island, N. Y., called the I. O. D. E. Home.

In responding to the call of duty and humanity, the I. O. D. E. in Illinois were most devoted. In 1915 a bazaar was held which furnished funds for two motor ambulances for the British army. The presentation was made to the British Red Cross by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in the name of the Imperial Order Daughters of the British Empire.

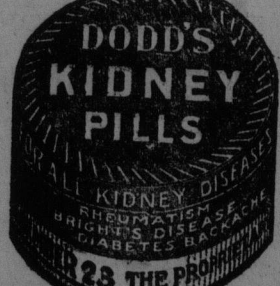
The largest undertaking of the I. O. D. E. in war times was the booth at the Allied Bazaar in 1917, when the sum of \$45,000 was realized. The expenses of this booth amounted to only \$57. Money was subscribed to many well known funds and eight rooms in the Star and Garter Hotel, were equipped, one of them being endowed in perpetuity. In all \$100,000 has been raised for war relief since 1914.

After the United States entered the war, the Order endeavored to participate in all activities of the State such as the Liberty Loan and War Saving Stamp drives. The recreation of the soldiers were looked after, and much Red Cross sewing accomplished. While looking after these overseas the poor at home were not forgotten, and in many cases of distress were alleviated and comfort given to the sick and sorrowing.

## Moonshine Game In The Dominion

Inland Revenue Authorities in Last Four Years Have Discovered 642 Cases of Illicit Distillery Operations—Ontario the Leading Offender.

Perhaps because it is noted for its sunshine, New Brunswick knows next to nothing of the art of moonshining, and the same is true of the sister province of Prince Edward Island, where the silver foxes flourish now and then. In the last four years the Inland Revenue authorities of the Dominion have discovered 642 cases of illicit distillery operation, and only four of these discoveries were in New Brunswick, and two in Prince Edward Island. Unfortunately for the law-abiding reputation of the Maritime Provinces, 24 cases of discoveries of illegal stills were reported in Nova Scotia, and there will be general sorrow over this falling from grace of an erring sister.

All Canada will learn with amazement that Ontario, the province which boasts the possession of all the civic virtues, is by long odds the leading offender in the moonshine game. In Ontario there were 179 cases of discoveries of illicit distilling operations, whereas wicked Quebec only had 88 cases. Quebec Columbia was slightly ahead of Quebec in backsliding, having 88 cases reported. Alberta, the virgin prairie province, had 115 cases, Manitoba 78, and Saskatchewan 63.
