Mate Through Advertising.
SOME HAVE EYE TO
CASH WELL AS LOVE
Most of Those Using News-
paper Columns Are Jews—
Fee Snatchers Busy.

Vienna, Dec. 22.—There is an old
saying that "marriages are made in
Heaven," but in Austria many mar-
riages are made in the press. The
Vienna papers display long columns
of advertisements, and though some
of them are either the last resort of
the lonely maiden or the effort of the
reduced nobleman, posing as a busi-
ness man who only needs a sound
sum to "make millions," many lead
to happy unions.

Want Business As Well.
Most of the genuine male adver-
tisers not only want a wife, (prefer-
ably the daughter of a prominent
merchant or banker) but also a part-
nership in the future father-in-law's
business. The Jewish element pre-
dominates in most advertisements.
The following ads are copied from
the Vienna Free Press:
"Marriage desired by intelligent
business man, on the right side of
Christy, Jew, partner in an old-
established wholesale firm, in easy
circumstances. Wanted—a nice, sym-
pathetic girl of a good Jewish fam-
ily. Must have a large fortune."

wanted for "my sister" or "for my
friend"—a harmless deception.

crowns, handsome trosser, fine flat
—34 years old—a suitable suitor
(Fewish) may be a widower, but not
