Sir George Foster Begins Campaign In Prince Edward Island

With His Old Time Fire and Eloquence He Spoke on Tariff Question.

Charlottetown, P. E. I., Oct. 27—Sir George E. Foster gave the first of three addresses on Prince Edward Island to a large audience in Summerside tonight. He was greeted with rousing cheers and applause. He spokes with his old time fire and eloquence on the tariff situation, contending that protection was the mainstay of the country. Its object was to stimulate production and furnish employment, as good wages. He scored the Liberal and Agarian leaders for aiming to abolish protection. He emphatically denied the charge that the Government was controlled by the big intastest, and that there was squandering of the public money in the building of the mercantile marine.
