



Halibut at Halifax averaged during the five and a half years 9.12 cents per Ib, as compared with 14.375 cents are Ib, at Bos-ton; cod at Halifax averaged 3.62 cents per Ib, as compared with 7 cents at Boston; mackerel at Halifax averaged 14.8 cents per Ib, as compared with 33 cents at Boston.
