

"Under their economic system." Mr Hoover said, "no matter how much they moderate it in name, there can be no eal return to production in Russia, and therefore Russia will have no consider-able commodities to export and consequently no great ability to obtain

"The whole question from a trade point of view develops into furnishing lities equal to the gold, platinum and jewelry, variously estimated from \$60,000,000 to \$200,000,000 in the hands of the Bolshevik Government, and after that has been expended there can be little expectation of continued trade. "There has been but little trade for gold, because its title has been called into question by the French Government, and by threats of private actions in the courts en the ground that it is stolen or subject to foreign liens. If any one European nation accepts the gold, no doubt all of them will. "Europe cannot recover its economic stability until Russia returns to pro-duction. Trading for this parcel of gold would not effect this remedy—nor would the goods obtained by the Bolsheviki in return for it restore their production.
