TREATY.

HIS Britannic Majefty and the United States of America, being defirous by a Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation, to terminate their differences in fuch a manner, as, without reference to the merits of their refpective complaints and pretentions, may be the best calculated to produce mutual fatisfaction and good understanding: And alfo to regulate the commerce and navigation between their respective countries, territories and people, in fuch a manner as to render the lame reciprocally beneficial and fatisfactory; they have, refrectively, named their plenipotentiaries, and given them full power to treat of, and conclude, the faid treaty, that is to fay; His Britannic Majefty has named for his plenipotentiary, the Right Honorable William Wyndham, Baron Grenville, of Wotton, one of his Majesty's Privy Council, and his Majesty's principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Prefident of the faid United States, by and with the advice and confent of the Senate thereof, hath appointed for their plenipotentiary, the Honorable John Jay, Chief Juffice of the faid United States and their envoy extraordinary to his Majefty, who have agreed on and concluded the following articles ;
