Council of Oxford for twelve years, and has been Reeve and Warden of the Counties of Leeds and Grenville First returned to Leg. Assm. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Kemptville.*

CALDWELL, WILLIAM, CLYDE, B.A. (*North Lanark.*)

S. of the late Alex. Caldwell, a native of Scot. B. at Lanark, Ont., 14 May 1843. Ed. there, and graduated at Queen's Univ., Kingston, 1865. Is extensively engaged in lumbering. First returned to Leg. Assm, in 1872. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1875. Re-elected at g.e. 1879, and again in 1883. Was not a candidate at g.e. 1886. Re-elected 4 Oct., 1888, to fill vacancy caused by the death of the sitting mem., Mr. D. Hilliard, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Lanark, Ont.*

CAMPBELL, ALEXANDER FRANKLIN. (*East Algoma.*)

Father was born in Ireland of Scotch descent, and mother was born in England. They came to Can. about 1820 and went to Pennsylvania. They returned to Can. in 1884. B. March, 1845, at Mayfield, Tp. of Chinguacousy. Co. of Peel, and ed. at the Common School there, and afterwards at Brampton Grammar School. M. 1st, in June, 1870, Elizabeth, second dau. of L. M. Baldock, Esq., Toronto Tp.; she died 1872; 2nd in December, 1876. Josephine, fourth dau. of Robert Aitken, Esq., of Brampton, and grand dau. of Major Fugard, a veteran of the Peninsula War. Is a journalist, and was editor and publisher of the "*Brampton Conservator*" from 1873 to July, 1890. Was Deputy Reeve of Brampton from 1880 to 1885, and Mayor by acclamation during 1887 and 1888; was Presdt. of the Peel Co. Agric. and Arts Assoc. in 1889 and a dir. on the Board for several years; was Presdt. of Brampton Mechanics Institute for two terms; is Chairman of Brampton School Board, and
