HUDSPETH, ADAM, Q.C., (South Victoria.)

Called to the Bar, Ont., 1867, and apptd. a Q.C. 1881. Is a Bencher of the Law Soc. of Ont.; Deputy Judge of the Co. of Victoria and was Revising Barrister for North Victoria, 1885. An unsuccessful candidate for South Victoria in the Leg. Assem. at the bye election held July, 1875. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. Resigned, and re-elected 20 April, 1887. INNES. JAMES. (South Wellington.)

S. of Alex. Innes, of Huntley, Aberdeenshire, Scot. B. there 1 Feb. 1883. M., 3 Sept. 1873, in London, Eng., Hellen Gerrard, of Forgue, Aberdeenshire, Scot., and widow of the late Jonathan Date, planter, Grenada, West Indies. Was a School Teacher in Scotland for five years. On coming to Can. in 1853, he became a Reporter and Journalist, and has edited and published the Guelph Mercury since 1862. Was a High School Trustee for a number of years, and was a Chairman of the Guelph Board of Education for one year, 1s a dir. of the Guelph Building and Savings Soc. and of the Guelph Gas and Electric Light Co. First returned to Parlt, at g. e. 1882, aad re-elected at Jast g. e. A Liberal.—Guelph, Ont.

IVES, WILLIAM BULLOCK, Q.C. (Richmond and Wolfe.)

S. of Eli Ives and Artemissa Bullock; of English extraction. First settled in Connecticut; moved to the Co. of Stanstead among the first settlers on the Lake Memphremagog. B. in the Township of Compton, Co. Compton, 17 Nov. 1841. Self educated, after taking course in Compton Academy. M., 17 Nov. 1869, at Cookshire, Co. of Compton, Elizabeth E. only dau. of the Hon. J. H. Pope, M. P., Minister of Railways. Called to the Bar P.Q., 1857. Apptd. Q.C., 11 October, 1880. Is Presdt. of the Dominion Cattle Co., Texas, and a dir of the International Railway Co. of Maine. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1878; re-elected at g.e. 1882, and again at last g.e. A Conservative.—Sherbrooke, P.Q.
