HAGGART, Hon. JOHN GRAHAM, P.C. (*South Lanark.*)

S. of John Haggart, Esq., formerly of Breadalbane, Perthshire, Scot., but latterly of Perth, Lanark, Ont., by Isabella Graham, of the Isle of Skye, Inverness-shire, Scot. B. in Perth, Ont., 14 Nov., 1836. A mill-owner. Was for several years Mayor of Perth. An unsuccessful candidate for South Lanark in Leg. Assem., Ont., at g.e. 1867, and in 1869. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1872; re-elected at g.e. 1874, 1878, 1882, and at last g.e. Sworn of the Privy Council and apptd. Postmaster-General, 6 Aug. 1888. Re-elected by acclamation 22 Aug. 1888. A Liberal Conservative.—*Perth, Ont.; Rideau Club.*

HALE, FREDERICK HARDING. *Carleton, (N.B.)*

Father was a native of Irel., and came to Can. when a child. B. at Northampton, Co. Carleton, N.B., 8 Dec., 1844, and ed. there. M., first, Miss McGee (she died); second, Emma E., dau. of the late Moses Boyer. Is a lumber merchant, and a dir. of the St. John Valley Railway. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. HALL, ROBERT NEWTON, B.A., LL.D., Q.C. (*Sherbrooke.*)

S. of Rev. R. V. Hall. B. at Laprairie, P.Q., 26 July 1836. Ed. at Burlington, (U.S.) Univ., where he graduated B.A. in 1857. M., at Compton, 15 Oct., 1862, Lena, dau. of the late A. W. Kendrick, Esq. Called to the bar of L.C. at Montreal, 7 Oct. 1861. Apptd. Q.C., 11 Oct. 1880. Was Batonnier of St. Francis Section of the Bar, 1877 to 1881; General Batonnier of the Bar of the Prov. of Quebec, in 1878, and is Dean of the Faculty of Law Bishop's Coll., Lennoxville. Received the degree of LL.D., from the Coll. in 1880. Was a Govt. director of the Canadian Pacific Railway, 1873. Is Presidt. of Massachusetts Railway; a dir. of the Quebec Central Railway, and Presidt. of the Sherbrooke Gas and Water Co. Was one of the promoters and first President of the Eastern Townships Agricultural Asso. First returned to Parlt. at
