

Cabbie gets jail term

A Malton airport cabdriver has been sentenced to a total of six months in jail.

Juan Barroso, 31, of Etobicoke received three months for obstructing justice and three months for public mischief.

The second conviction related to a false claim by Barroso that police officers had stolen tapes, films and cameras during search of his motel room.

He was placed on 12 months probation on condition he not enter Toronto International Airport property without the permission of his probation officer.

Evidence at trial showed Barroso was fined \$310 for three separate traffic violations on airport property. An RCMP officer escorted the cab driver from the courtroom to the pay wicket.

The officer said Barroso began talking and pulling

pamphlets and leaflets from his pockets as the clerk came over.

Barroso leaned on the counter, his elbows on the charge sheets left there by the RCMP officer, giving the impression the papers belonged to him. He and the clerk went away and later, when the court bookkeeper tried to balance the total of fines collected, she discovered the three charge sheets were missing.

The cabbie was arrested after bragging to an RCMP inspector that he had taken the papers. The inspector was investigating allegations by Barroso against airport RCMP officers.

Peel detectives searched his motel room and recovered the charge sheets. Barroso was charged with public mischief after claiming the officers had stolen items from his room.

Two cops tackle fleeing suspect

A 20-year-old Ottawa man made a dash for freedom in the Peel provincial courthouse, but was tackled by two policemen.

Joseph Edwin Provost did not appear in court when his case was called and a bench warrant for his arrest was issued. He had been charged with assaulting causing bodily harm.

Provost showed up late, however, and was arrested by the court officer, police constable Roger Hinksman, on the bench warrant for failing to appear. Hinksman took Provost into the cell area behind the courtroom, but as

he was opening the cell door, the man bolted.

With Hinksman in hot pursuit, Provost ran through the building and into the lobby, about 100 feet. Hinksman called to OPP corporal Pete Bawden and police constable Dave Crown, who were sitting on a bench outside a courtroom. The two tackled Provost as he headed for the main door. Hinksman caught up and the man was handcuffed.

Provost was returned to the cells, and subsequently charged with attempting to escape custody and failing to appear.

Police probing two mail thefts

Peel police are investigating two incidents of mail theft.

A Canada Post truck dropped off a sack of mail in the mailroom of an apartment building at 1257 Lakeshore Rd. E. The door to the room was left locked.

When the postman arrived to sort the mail, he found the

door still locked, but the mail gone. Police searched the area, but have not recovered the mail bag.

In an apartment building at 20 Elizabeth St. North, four mail boxes were broken into. Police say the motive may have been theft of credit cards and cheques from the mail.

The registration period can be arranged for weekly, monthly or 10-week sessions.

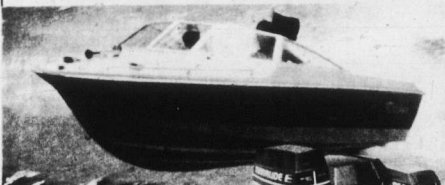

NOTICE OF APPLICATION

FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF an Application by the

CREDIT VALLEY CONSERVATION AUTHORITY

for approval to expropriate land being part of Block 'B' Registered Plan 802 and part of Lots 26 and 27, Concession 3 South of Dundas Street, City of Mississauga (formerly Town of Mississauga) Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly County of Peel) for the purpose of conserving and managing the marshlands and so much of the lands contiguous thereto as is necessary for such purpose in the area known as the "Ratray Marsh" as a viable ecological natural resource and of acquiring additional parklands for the Regional Municipality of Peel.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described as follows:

Parts 1 to 22 inclusive on the sketch of plan a copy of which is shown below, having been prepared by C. A. Sexton, Ontario Land Surveyor, which parts form part of Block 'B', Registered Plan 802 and part of Lots 26 and 27, Concession 3 South of Dundas Street, City of Mississauga (formerly Town of Mississauga) Regional Municipality of Peel (formerly County of Peel).

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably

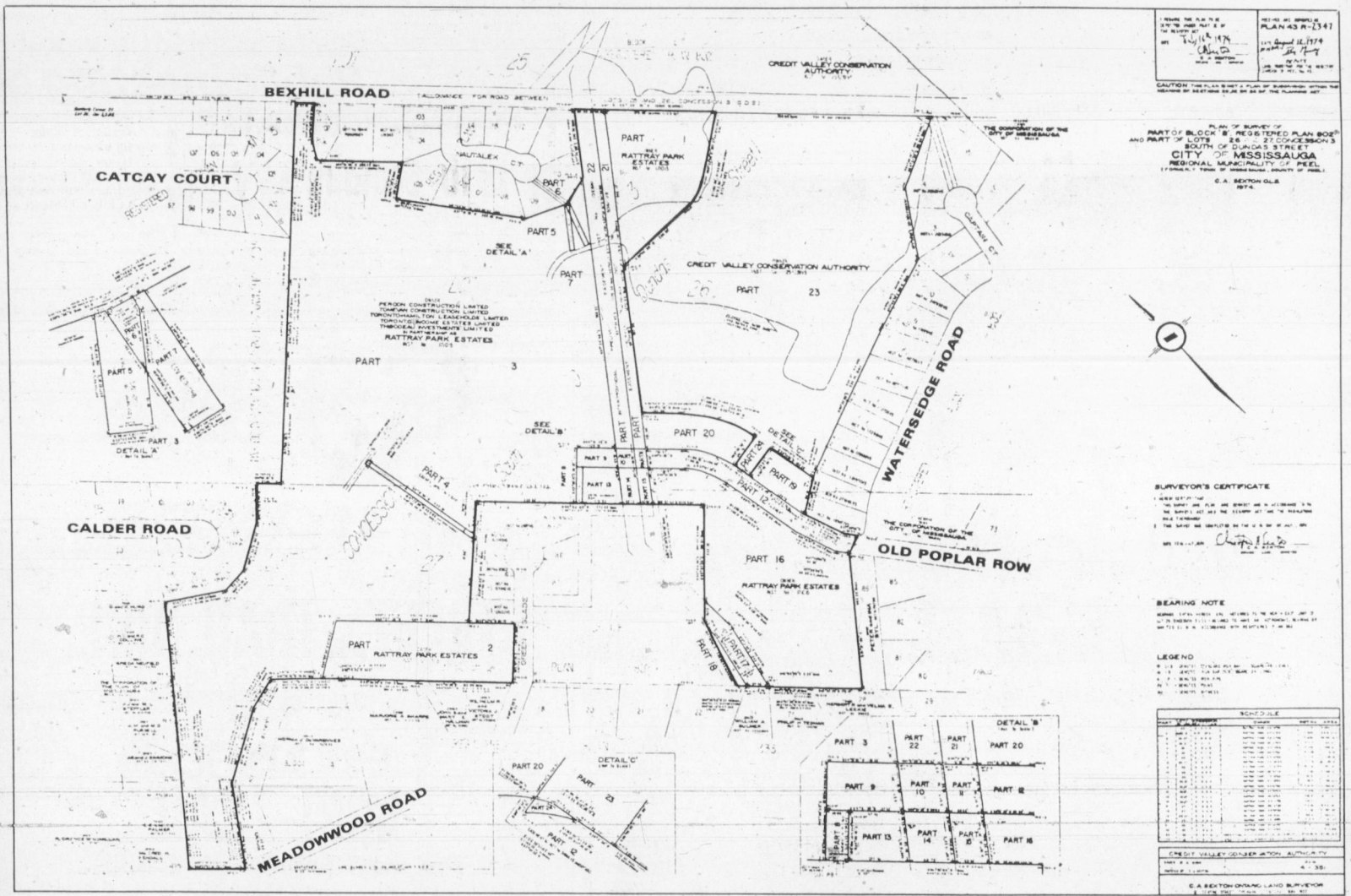
necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

- (a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that,
 - (a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;
 - (b) the inquiry officer,
 - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
 - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;

3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
