Sheridan programs

Special courses have been set up by Sheridan College in conjunction with the Ontario School for the Deaf to give both deaf people and those who hear opportunities for contact with each other. The classes will be held at the O.S.D. campus in Milton beginning Oct. 21 every Thursday until March. Registration for the small classes will be on a first-come, first served basis with deaf students having first preference. Courses offered include three of special interest to deaf persons: language for the Deaf (writing and reading skills for the profoundly deaf); English for New Canadians (oral proficiency); and Total Communication (beginner's fingerspelling and sign language).

Police beat

Mississauga Police were kept hopping over the long weekend with a series of major and minor traffic accidents.

On Thursday morning Carl Easton was collecting garbage at the back of a garbage truck facing south on Caven St. in Lakeview when he walked out into the traffic lane.

Police say a car driven by Thomas Cusack, 29, of Seneca Ave., in Mississauga, was northbound on Caven St. at the same time and could not avoid hitting Easton.

Easton, 18, of Queensway West, was taken to Mississauga Hospital and released after treatment for cuts and bruises. No charges have been laid.

TWO HURT
On Saturday at 2:08 p.m. a car driven by 64 year old Charles Sproule of Dundas St. was eastbound on Dundas and, according to the police description, he tried to make a left turn onto Cawthra Road.

Ron Thomas, 20, of Delta Street in Toronto, was westbound and rammed into the Sproule auto. Sproule has been charged with making an improper left turn.

Ida Sproule, 37, and both Thomas and his passenger Richard Bartlett, 18, of Banner Hill Dr., were injured and taken to Mississauga Hospital for treatment.

Thomas and Sproule were released after treatment and hospital officials list Bartlett's condition as satisfactory.

HOSPITALIZED
Less than two hours later a similar collision at Gorway Drive and Etude Road in Malton sent Chris McDonald, 19, of Carswell Place in Toronto, to Mississauga Hospital for treatment of a concussion and possible fractures.

He was a passenger in a car driven by Derek Ginson, 19, of Manion Road, which was southbound on Gorway when it collided with an auto turning left onto Etude Dr. from the northbound lane of Gorway Drive.

Nerrisa Dinnall, 29, of Cambrett Ave. in Malton, has been charged with making an unsafe left turn.

THREE-CAR CRASH
At 8:40 Monday night police report that Mrs. Jean Borg, 35, of Misener Cres. in Clarkson, was eastbound on Dundas Highway near Dixie Road. Both George Wilson, 22, of Toronto and Harold Morrison, 29, of Fieldgate Dr. were driving north on Dixie Road in their autos and entered the intersection of the two roads on a green light.

Police say Mrs. Borg went through a red light and crashed into the side of the two northbound vehicles. Her car carried on and knocked down the signal light standard on the median strip of Dundas Highway.

Mrs. Borg was taken to hospital and treated for cuts and bruises. Total damages to the three cars is estimated at almost \$4,000.
