To the Deputy Minister-

The reserve referred to in letter of the 20th ultimo, from Mr. James Mackay, of Prince Albert, is Indian Reserve No. 106 A, which was set aside under Treaty 6 by Order in Council of the 6th of January, 1900, for the Montreal Lake and Lac la Ronge Indians. The reserve contains an area of 56 square miles. In 1907 the question of surrender of this reserve was before the Department, but although the forms of surrender were prepared, authority to Agent Borthwick to submit same to the Indians was not given. Mr. Agent Borthwick on the 4th of February, 1908, submitted an agreement with the Montreal Lake and Lac la Ronge Indians to surrender this reserve to be sold for their benefit, but on memo by the undersigned of the 11th of February, 1908, the matter was allowed to stand.

The Department does not appear to have information as to what Inffans have gone to this ar reserve and are at present

resigns thereon.
