Uplands, Ontario	October 16th 1944		Weather cloudy to overcast, hazy with occasional showers. The first basketball games of the season were staged this evening, with two teams from Pendleton competing against our W.D.'s and aircrew. The girls' game was won by Uplands, but the Pendleton team won the laurels for the men. It was a fast, hard-fought game that kept all players on their toes till the very last whistle.	
	October 17th 1944		Clear to partly cloudy. Squadron Leader S.J. Madill, New Zealand Air Liaison Mission, visited this Unit.	
	October 18th 1944		Partly cloudy to cloudy; 5½ hours dual, 4 hours solo flying.	
	October 19th 1944		C.A.V.U. . A full day's flying carried out. All sections held Victory Bond rallies in preparation for the opening of the Victory Loan drive on Monday. F/L Goodenough of W. & B. Branch and F/L Savage of Link Trainer Branch visited this Unit.	
	October 20th 1944		Cloudy to partly cloudy. 9½ hours flying. The "Uplands News" published a fine front page editorial encouraging everyone to buy War Bonds and explaining the benefits thereof. Commanding Officer's parade was held, as usual, and the Training Wing inspected.	
	October 21st 1944		Weather cloudy to partly cloudy. 8½ hours solo flying.	
	October 22nd 1944		No flying. Movie in the Recreation Hall in the evening.	
	October 23rd 1944		Clear to cloudy, overcast in afternoon. Opening of Victory Loan and \$22,300.00 - 22%, was subscribed on the first day of the campaign.	
	October 24th 1944		Instructions were received to have all Aircrew I.T.S. transfer to Army or be discharged. Commanding Officer's parade held in the Drill Hall. The large Victory Loan flag was raised and the Commanding Officer spoke to the personnel on parade, encouraging them to help their country in this critical moment, as well as help themselves by saving for the future. Guards from this Unit were posted in Ottawa to give information and safeguard the Hurricane on display in the City.
