The accused, No D-59200, Private Joseph Alme SABOUNIN, of the Royal 22e Regiment, on the strength of No 6 Canadian Infantry Reinforcement Unit, a soldier of the Canadian Army Overseas, is charged with:

First Charge
Section 10(i)
Army Act

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE,
ABSENTING HIMSELF WITHOUT LEAVE,

in that he,

in the Field, did absent himself without leave from 2359 hours on the 12th day of June, 1943, until he was apprehended at Coventry at 210 hours on the 18th day of June, 1943, thereby incurring expenses for his return to his unit to the amount of one pound and seven pence (£1.0.7).
(Total absence, 5 days, 21 hours, 1 minute).

Second Charge
Section 9(ii)
Army Act

WHILE ON ACTIVE SERVICE, DISOBEYED AN
IN SUCH MANNER AS TO SHOW WILLFUL
DEFIANCE OF AN ORDER A LAWFUL COMMAND
GIVEN PERSONALLY BY HIS SUPERIOR OFFICER
IN THE EXERCISE OF HIS OFFICE,

in that he,

on the 30th day of June, 1943, when in custody in the Moor Lane Guardroom at Birmingham, upon being ordered to peel some potatoes by Sgt L.R. Brades, his superior officer who was then in charge of the Prisoners' Compound, did not do so, saying: "I am not going to do any work at all," or words to that effect.
