Q. When he was found, the cap was on his head?

A. Yes.

Q. Where was the body found?

A. 106 yards from the corner of Voght Street, down Coldwater Avenue, and 14 yards North of Coldwater Avenue. His head and shoulders, to the waist, under the wagon.
