All goods not enumerated in this Act or any other Act as charged with any duty of Customs, and not declared free of duty by this Ac., shall be charged with a duty of twenty per cent. ad valorem, when imported into Canada, or taken out of warehouse for consumption therein.

GOODS FREE IN THE CASES THEREIN MENTIONED.

The following articles, when the natural products, of the colony of Newfoundland, viz. : Animals of all kinds.

PROHIBITED

The following articles shall be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of 200 dollars, together with the forfeiture of the parcel or packages of goods

Books, Printed Papers, Paintings, Drawings, Prints, Photographs or representations of any kind of a treasonable or seditious, or of an immoral or indecent character. Coin, base or counterfeit.

Reprints of Canadian Copywright Works, and reprints of British Copyright Works, which have been Copyrighted in Canada.

Goods manufactured or produced, wholly or in part, by prison labor, or which have been made within or in connection with any prison, gaol or aenitentiary, shall not be imported into Canada, under a penalty of two hundred dollars, and if imported, such goods and the parcels or packages in

No oleomargarine, butterine, or other simllar substitute for butter, shall be imported into Canada, under a penalty of not more than four hundred dollars and not less than two hundred dollars for each offence, and if imported, the same and the packages within which it is contained shall be forfeited.

The export of deer wild turkeys, quail, partridge, prairie fowl and wood-cock in the carcass or parts thereof, is hereby declared unlawful and prohibited; and any person exporting or attempting to export any such article shall, for each such offence, incur a penalty of one hundred dollars, and the articles so attempted to be exported shall be forfeited, and may, on reasonable cause of suspicion of intention to export the same, be seized by any officer of the Customs, and if such intention is proved, shall be dealt with as for a breach
