THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 3 and 26, which has not been home-seaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other pur-poses, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quatter section of 160 acres, more or less. or less

Entry may be made personally at he local land office for the District a which the land to be taken is

s'tuate, or if the homesteader de-sives he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Locai Agent for the District' in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him.
