All any of the Temporary Laws, which are annually continued, having flood the test of experience, and been found useful and expedient, I submit to the consideration of the Assembly, the propriety of rendering them perpetual by a short Bill, in which I shall readily concur.

You may also rely on my concurrence inevery measure which, on due consideration, shall appear to be conducive to the advantage of His Majesty's Government, and the interest and prosperity of the Province; and I recommend to you, in all your proceedings, diligence, moderation, and mutual forbearance, with as much dispatch, as the nature of the befores that may come before you, will admit of.

Mr. Pyke, presented to the House an Account from Mr. Treasurer Wallace, of all Monies received by him into, and payments by him made from, the Province Treasury, between the 3.1st October, 1806, and the 3.1st October, 1807.

Ordered, That the Account do lie on the Table to be perufed by the Members of the Ilou'e.

On motion, refolved, that Joseph Aplin, Esq; be employed in drafting and preparing such Bills as may be required by the House, in the present Sessions; and that this is liquide will provide for the payment of his services.
