ZIONISM NOT OF THIS WORLD SAYS WRITER

Lucien Wolff Writes To Prove that Jew is Confusing Eschatology With Politics

The approach of a Jewish congress to be held September next, and the agitation connected therewith in wide Jewish circles makes very timely a clear, unbiased survey of the Jewish national movement, as it is presented in the April issue of the "Edinburgh Review" by one of the foremost English Jews, the well known journalist and historian, Lucien Wolff, one of the few really competent writers on Jewish affairs in Great Britain. The Jewish nationality problem has more or less silently developed itself in Eastern Europe, during the last thirty-five years, i.e. since 1882, when the first great exodus from Russia to Western Europe and America set in. Few people know that Western Russia alone harbors close to 7,000,000 Jews; while in the adjacent territories, to which a new political geography will have to be given, are little short of another couple of millions. In other words the "unredeemed" Hebrews in the east of Europe are equal in number to the combined Czech-Slovak, Serb and Italian "Irredentas," and their national consciousness is not less definite than that of any other of the many races who constitute the ethnographic wildpool of Eastern and Southern Europe. The complexity of the problem to be solved one day at the green table can best be gauged if we consider that the Jew constitutes 14 per cent of the total population of "Russia" in Poland, now solidly occupied by the armies of Germany and Austria, and that 40 per cent of the townfolk are more or less lineal descendants of the Patriarchs. The Zionist movement, this latest manifestation of the national spirit which has been responsible for the unification of Germany and Italy and is partly responsible for the present Howard-Crestonian origin, is a child of its immediate environment; its roots are not sunk in the soil of inherited tradition and ethnographic peculiarities. From the East the Kibbutz who raised the flag of Jewish revolt against Rome for the last time in the year 132 A.D., to our own time, there is scarcely a trace of Jewish national feeling, in the political sense of the word, in Jewish history and literature. The Zionists simply confuse eschatology with politics. The prayers in the Jewish liturgy for the restoration of the temple and the Holy City, which are not for the satisfaction of a worldly craving, but express the longing after the fulfillment of a divine scheme of human redemption. And the Orthodox non-Zionist Jews of Central and Western Europe of the United States, Canada, Australia and South Africa to this very hour see the redemption prayers in the exclusive light of religious belief. The Jews are instinctively the most assimilative of peoples.
