Mr. Rupert Wheaton of Dorchester, Mass., arrived on Tuesday last to spend two weeks with his relatives at Centreville. His cousin Mr. Leander Martin also of Dorchester is expected this week to visit his former home.

Death of C. F. Rockwell, Esq.
The death of Charles F. Rockwell, took place at his residence Kentville early Monday morning after a short illness at the age of 69 years.

Mr. Rockwell was born at Upper Dyke in this County, July 3, 1847, son of the late Judah and Prudence Rockwell. During his early life he engaged in teaching and filled that position in many of the leading schools of the county. He married Anna Kidston of Cornwallis and had two children who survive him. Mrs. Frank Fowler and Mrs. Harry S. Dodge of Bridgetown. He married for his second wife Ada Murphy of Cornwallis who survives him. Mr. J. Parks Rockwell of Portland, Me., and Mrs. Wilfred Cox of Upper Dyke are brother and sister of deceased.

About 25 years ago Mr. Rockwell moved to Kentville and was appointed to the position of Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, also acting as a Stipendiary Magistrate. On the death of Stephen Belcher, he succeeded to the office of High Sheriff and retained that until about a year ago when failing health prevented him from driving through the County, he resigned and was reappointed to his former office of Prothonotary.

He was prominent for years in civic politics being Councilor for the town and also Mayor for several years. Among the fraternal orders he was very prominent, being an Oddfellow for 43 years and a Past Grand Master of the order. He also was a member of the Masonic Lodge and filled important positions there.

Socially Mr. Rockwell was a man most highly esteemed, being willing to help any one. In the hours of grief over beloved ones removed, no one with whom he was acquainted ever failed to get expressions of sorrow and assistance from him.

The funeral service will be held from the residence on Wednesday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock conducted by Rev. A. C. Borden. The services will be under the auspices of the I. O. O. F. and burial at Upper Canada.
