Western Fishery.

The Board of Trade received the following report from Sub-Collector Cunningham yesterday, giving the fishery report from Connoire to Red Island for the week ending April 23. "Total landed to date 900 qts. total for week 120, no traps in the water, 60 boats fishing. A good sign of cod in deep water, but herring scarce. The weather for the week was changeable, winds moderate, ice not far from the land. The first cod since January caught this week one boat getting 8 qts. for one day, but many getting little or none. The catch to date is the worst for 40 years, we have no bankers or schrs. of any kind fishing, and merchants will hardly buy green fish. This is making it hard for fishermen who are not supplied."

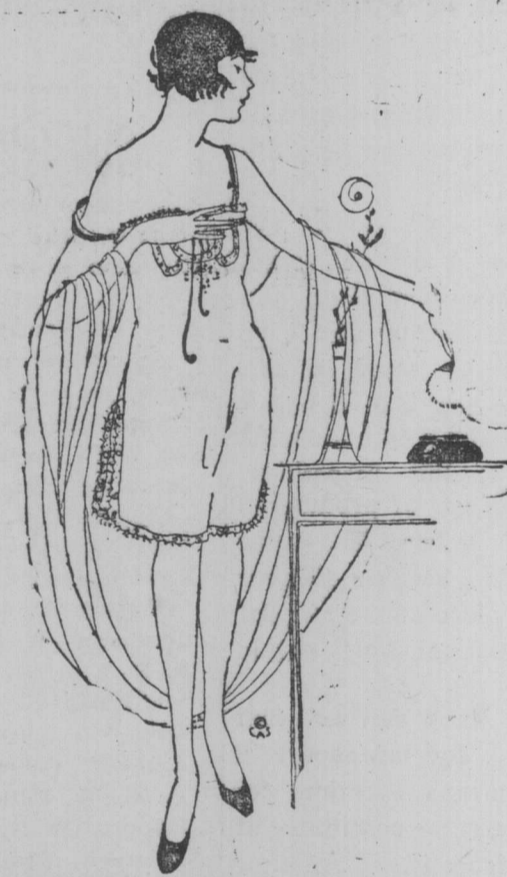
