COUNTY CURRENCY.

Items of Interest from over the County.
 A Weekly Digest of the County News Served up to Suit Readers of "The Signal," Fifth and Point, Clipped and Condensed from Every Section.

The following parties from this county have passed their examinations for junior matriculation in Toronto University: A. Bodge, T. L. Gray and A. J. McKenzie, Clinton; E. E. Harvey and W. H. Moore, Goderich; J. S. Muldrew, Seaforth.
 The voters lists for the town of Wingham have been issued. There are on this year's list 449 voters for municipal and parliamentary purposes, 213 for municipal only and 50 for parliamentary only; against 429, 111 and 23, respectively, last year.
 The Rev. James Fritchard, of Forest, Blyth Presbyterian church on Sabbath, the 18th inst. Mr. Fritchard's congregation having given him a few weeks' holidays, he has taken a trip up the lakes, and will be in Blyth on his return.
 The amount raised by the Methodists of Nile circuit, for the last financial year, was by envelopes, quarters and loose collections, \$855.85; the various other funds of the church as follows:—Parsonage trustee board, \$615.10; missionary fund, \$117.90; Sunday school, \$75; s. s. extension fund, \$2.41; Sunday school aid, \$1; educational fund, \$3.44; general conference fund, \$4.11; union church relief, \$2.15; contingent fund, \$3.44; woman's missionary society, \$3; college fund, \$55; all other purposes, \$351.12; grand total, \$1839.63.
 A base ball match was played on the Recreation grounds, Seaforth, on Wednesday 7th, between Brussels and Exeter. The match was for the championship of Huron and a money stake of \$100. It elicited a great deal of interest in the towns from which the respective clubs came. The people of Brussels and Exeter seemed to have turned out en masse, while both Clinton and Mitchell furnished their due quota of spectators. Judging by the gate receipts there were over five hundred people on the ground. The match was very keenly contested and there was some excellent playing on both sides. The result was a score of 19 to 14 in favor of Brussels. The game was umpired by Mr. Alex. Murdoch, of Goderich, who seemed to give the best of satisfaction to all concerned. Both clubs seemed to be on the best of terms and the match was pleasantly and creditably conducted throughout.
 A meeting of the officers and directors of the Ontario Mutual Live Stock Insurance Company was held in Seaforth on Monday last week. The directors are using every exertion to get the machinery in operation as soon as possible. The company will be incorporated by the Government as soon as the deposit is made, all the preliminary matters having been complied with, and the money for the deposit is being collected in as rapid a way as possible. A committee have now in hand the work of preparing the by-laws and forms, and so soon as they complete their work, and the forms are printed, the company will be in a position to commence business. From assurances already received there is no doubt but a large business will be done from the very start, and that a strong and reliable company will be formed which will be of the greatest advantage to stock breeders and importers, and which will aid materially in encouraging the breeding and importing of the very best animals.
 The death of Mr. G. Amest, of Seaforth is announced. Mr. Amest went to Seaforth from the county of Waterloo about seventeen years ago and engaged extensively in the stove and barrel manufacturing business, which enterprise he conducted until his death. He was a good business man and was thoroughly upright and honorable in all his dealings, while his social qualities were of a high order and his genial disposition and warm heart made him a universal favorite with all who enjoyed the pleasure of his acquaintance. He leaves a widow and large family who will ever cherish with loving affection the memory of a kind husband and indulgent parent. The funeral took place on Monday and was very largely attended, some of his old neighbors from Waterloo being present to pay a last tribute of respect to an old and esteemed friend.
