August 21st, 1922. Dear Sir Michael Cashin .-- Myself luded the bunch of men whom you so generously assisted to get to their dictates of common gratitude to send you a note of thanks for the kindly nterest that you took in us in helping us to get home from Badger. have been speaking to most of the mer and they all. I assure you, highly appreciate what you did for us and have no doubt that it will be remembered in time to come. Several of them requested me to drop you a line of need. Would to God that the whole country knew you as you really are, and not as your political enemies represent you. There would then b some hope for the future of Newoundland. There was one thing that no man with a heart in him would trying to get home from a place where they could not earn enough to provide a bit of food for their families. The men got so disgusted that they could stand it no longer. What made matters worse was to meet all along the line squads of police as if the men had committed murder or some other serious crime. I can tell you, sir, that this is the driving of the last nail in the coffin of the Government. These men and myself included are not lazy loafers, but have always been independent of the Government or anyone else in earning our living. Most of us have worked at the coal mines in Sydney and other places and at various jobs of the hardest kind both in Canada and the United States, but since things have gone so bad in those places we have been compelled to stay in Newfoundland and have been pinned to the wall by the way in which the Government have mis-
