A large number of members were present at the regular monthly meeting of the London Bicycle Club last night at the club rooms. Dr. Balfour, the popular president, occupied the chair. The club passed a resolution complimenting the C. W. A. members for their excellent choice in selecting the doctor as their vice-president for the current year. The boys are confident he will make as great a success in his position as vice-president as he has as president of the C. W. A. The doctor intends to conduct a large wheeling party to the annual meet at Waterloo on Dominion Day, and all wheelmen intending to ride to Waterloo are requested to send in their names so that hotel accommodation may be secured.

Fifteen new members were elected to the club, and the membership roll is rapidly increasing.

The committee having the new track in charge have been working hard to get the stock list filled up, but are disappointed at the apparent lack of interest the wheelmen are taking in the matter of subscribing for the stock, and they would like all who have not yet subscribed to do so at once, and be more enthusiastic in the matter, as it means a great deal to the city at large, as well as the wheelmen, to have visitors at the meets the club has had several spokes in the wheels.
