**LIFE-SAVING BOAT

It has not yet been bought, and Wednesday the department was put to considerable inconvenience in getting a boat, and taking it to the river.
Chief Aiken and Ald. Garratt, chairman of No. 2 committee, had a conference Thursday, and it is likely the matter will be brought to the attention of the board of works.

**THE COMMISSIONERS
WILL NOT RESIGN**

Not in the Least Disturbed by the Real Estate.

ANSWER TO CHARGES

Chairman Darch Claims that R. E. O. P. A. Has Wandered Far Astray.

The water commissioners will not resign at the request of the Real Estate Owners' Association.

They will serve out their terms of office, regardless of what the R. E. O. P. A. says.

Chairman William Jones has to the end of the year to serve, and will not retire a minute before his time is up.

Neither will Commissioner Darch step out.

"I was elected by the people, and I will remain in office until the people ask me to resign, or defeat me at the polls," said Mr. Darch. "It will not resign at the request of any faction or clique. I am the servant of all the people, and I intend to stick."

The Real Estate Owners are away astray in their opposition to the water bylaw. They accuse us of putting \$115,000 on to the Beck scheme, which is altogether wrong.

"The main extension bylaw is a separate one, distinct completely from the Beck well scheme."

"We put the sum of \$25,000 for mains on to Mr. Beck's proposition, but as much as \$500 are paid for the water from the wells. It was merely a protection for all concerned."

As to the Mains.

"As for the mains, we submit them separately, and the people will have to express their opinion on that score."

"If my memory serves me right, I do not think Mr. Beck opposed any main extension scheme being attached to his proposition so long as he was assured that it was needed."

Mayor Stevely will not resign either. He will serve his term out as mayor, paying no attention to the resolutions of the R. E. O. P. A.

"I have heard nothing about his resigning," said his worship. "I do not know that they want me to. I will finish my term."
