GO TO AMERICAN MARKET

Hog Buyers in Canada Will Have to Pay Better Prices in the Future.

The placing of hogs on the free list under the new tariff agreement will be a decided benefit to the farmers, and it is probable that during the coming

near a great deal more attention will be devoted to hog raising. Under the old agreement a duty of \$1.50 was placed on each animal entering the American markets from Canada. Elsewhere with this, some of the shippers in this country have been sending large consignments to the Buffalo and Chicago markets. As a result, the price charged by the Toronto buyers.

Mr. Dan McIntyre, the largest local shipper, was interviewed on the subject. He said that the new price, starting Monday morning, is \$1.00 per hundred pounds. He states that the new arrangement will be very profitable for the farmers, and to a good many of them, it will mean a great deal of money to raise the price of pork in this country. At the present time, the American markets are a little weaker than the Canadian ones.

The Commission Men. The new agreement will also affect the commission merchants at Toronto, which is supposed to be the local centre for hog shipments. The commission men will have much less to do than the American markets. With the present cut on hogs lifted, and a good demand for the markets on the other side, all the Canadian shippers will be seeking to get their hogs to the U.S. market. In order to get hogs the Canadian packers will have to pay a higher price. This will be the means of breaking up any combines for the purpose of buying at low prices and selling at high prices. The packers will reap the benefits of the new agreement, and the higher the price goes, the larger the benefit.
