Auto Crashed Into Loaded Street Car

Three Were Hurt, One Badly in Accident at Windsor.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Windsor, June 17.—Three persons were injured, one seriously, when a well-loaded Walkerville Belt Line car struck an automobile broadside at Goyeau and Wyandotte streets at 8 o'clock last evening.

The three occupants of the automobile, A. A. Thompson, Windsor, liquor dealer, and A. M. Wischer and Lawrence Mackenzie, 118 Windermere road, Walkerville, were thrown to the sidewalk about 20 feet away. Thompson and Wischer were picked up and were soon able to go to their homes, but Mackenzie, who was badly bruised on the head and body, was taken to the Hotel Dieu in the police ambulance. Dr. Dewar, who attended at the scene of the accident, declares his injuries serious.

According to the story told the hospital authorities by Mackenzie, Thompson, who was driving the car, slowed down at the intersection, but saw no street car. The occupants of the automobile said that the motorist did not ring his bell. S. Knox was motorist, and H. Buckner, conductor. The automobile was wrecked.

JUMPED INTO RIVER

Young English Girl at Guelph Was Despondent.

Will Hold Inquest In Shooting Case

Collingwood, People Want Death of Mrs. Calback Probed.

Collingwood, June 16.—There will be an inquest on the death of Mrs. James Calback, who is supposed to have been killed accidentally here on Saturday night by a shot from a rifle in the hands of her son, aged 4, to whom she had given the weapon as a plaything.

This is the result of action taken by Police Magistrate Hogg, who notified Crown Attorney Cotter, of Barrie, that an inquest had been considered necessary by Coroner McPaul, and secured from the crown official instructions to order one. Popular opinion is emphatic in demanding an investigation of the affair.

The inquest was opened late this afternoon by Dr. McPaul, and adjourned to Wednesday at 1 o'clock. The jury asked that a post-mortem examination be made in the meantime.

LEAPED OVER FALLS

Buffalo Man Ended His Life While Visiting at Niagara.

[Special to The Advertiser.] Niagara Falls, June 16.—Fred H. Hermann, of Buffalo, ended his life by leaping into the Luna Rapids from the bridge connecting it with Goat Island this afternoon. The man was first seen standing on the railing of the bridge by a man and a woman, tourists. For a moment their view was hidden by the trees and when their vision was again unobstructed they were in time to see the upstretched arms disappear below the floor of the bridge.

A straw hat and gray coat were found on the bridge, and in the pockets were papers which led to identification. A message from Buffalo stated that Hermann had left home saying that he was going to Niagara Falls.

Doubts Figures of Canon Hague

Dr. Lyle Does Not Think White Slave Statistics Are Accurate.

Hamilton, June 17.—The remarks of Canon Dyson Hague, formerly of London, at a recent meeting of the Anglican Synod at Toronto, to the effect that the girls disappeared from that place each year, and that they had been lured across the Niagara River as white slaves, has caused considerable comment about Hamilton. Rev. Dr. Lyle, then interviewed by the press, said that such a statement was greatly exaggerated. He did not believe that any such number fell into the clutches of white slave agents, and doubted if it could be shown that half that number fell victims to the traffic every year. It was extremely difficult for anyone to give an estimate on such a question, as the families of the victims usually kept the information under cover.

Speaking about Hamilton, Dr. Lyle said that although there had been such cases reported here, he did not believe that the number would reach 25 in a year.

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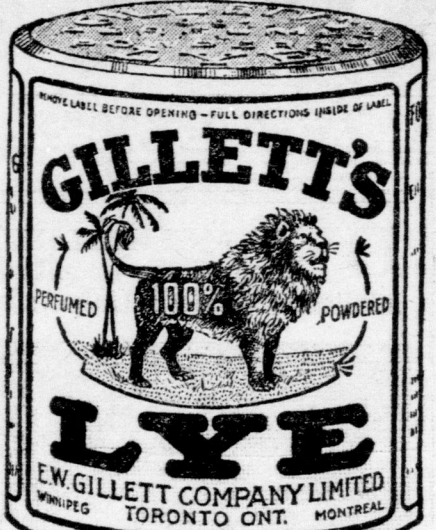
